Towards the end of the 1990s the Southern African Catholic Bishops' Conference (SACBC) decided there was a need for a coordinated response to the HIV epidemic that was affecting Southern Africa. The SACBC Aids office was then established. Sr Alison Munro OP was the first director of the office. In 2000 she applied and was awarded a large grant from Catholic Relief Services. Those days, the main goal was to support small Catholic HIV projects scattered through our Conference area.


From 2004, and once again thanks to CRS, our Conference was able to start providing antiretroviral treatment and, in this way, help to keep people alive and not only provide palliative care. Over 40.000 people were initiated into the treatment thanks to this partnership.

“It is noted that CRS has supported the AIDS Office since 2000 and its total funding commitment has exceeded that of any other donor other than PEPFAR: R 37 million between 2000 and December 2012”(Sr Alison Munro OP, *“Catholic Responses to AIDS in Southern Africa”*, 2014)
